| L  | <b>Cimicifuga simplex 'Brunette' 6'</b> Fall blooming, white flowers, very fragrant, dark stems/leaves. Takes shade.  |      |
| <b>Agastache (hyssop) sun</b>                            |   |      |
| F  | <b>Agastache foeniculum 18"</b> Spikes of purple blue flowers in summer, attracts bees/butterflies  |      |
| F  | <b>Agastache 'Golden Jubilee' 18-24"</b> Blue flowers over chartreuse-yellow foliage  |      |
| <b>Alchemilla (lady's mantle) sun/pt.shade</b>           |   |      |
| T, L, P  | <b>Alchemilla mollis 10-16"</b> Handsome edger. Sprays of chartreuse flowers in July, splendid fan shaped pleated foliage that collect dew drops as sparkling jewels, good cut flowers.   |      |
| <b>Allium (ornamental onion) sun / well drained soil</b> |   |      |
|  | <b><u>Allium General:</u></b> Drought tolerant. Very easy to grow, carefree, needs a dry location. Showy in mass. Flowers can be dried by standing upright in a container without water. Foliage is low with blossoms towering above. Deer proof. |      |
| T  | <b>Allium hollandicum 'Purple Sensation' 2'</b> Large purple sphere blossoms on 3' stems, let self seed after 1st year, summer dormant so inter-plant with perennials.  |      |
| T  | <b>Allium schoenoprasum 1'</b> Abundant red-pink flowers in spring, chive-like foliage  |      |
| T  | <b>Allium senescens glaucum (corkscrew chives) 10"</b> Twisted blue-green basal leaves, 3" lavender-pink umbels on 20" stems in July-Aug. Drought tolerant.   |      |
| T  | <b>Allium senescens 1'</b> Bright green flat foliage. 3" lavender-pink umbels on 20" stems in July-Aug. Drought tolerant.   |      |
| L  | <b>Allium cv. 1'</b> Lavender globes. Takes pt.shade.   |      |
| <b>Amsonia (blue star) sun/pt.shade</b>                  |   |      |
| T, F, L  | <b>Amsonia tabernaemontana 3-4'</b> Willow-like leaves, golden fall color, light blue starry flowers May-June, easy to grow, long-lived. Structural plant.  |      |
| <b>Anemone (Japanese windflower) pt.shade</b>            |   |      |
| F  | <b>Anemone cruciata 16"</b> White nodding flowers in May/June   | N    |
| T  | <b>Anemone 'Whirlwind' 3'</b> Large semi-double white petals, golden center. Late summer to fall.   | N    |
| T  | <b>Anemone misc. 2-3'</b> Abundant silvery pink flowers, attractive foliage. Late summer to fall.   |      |

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|      | <b>Anthemis (golden marguerite) sun/pt.shade</b>   |     |
| T    | <b>Anthemis misc. 3-4'</b> Abundant golden or white daisies all summer, good cut flower.   | N   |
|      | <b>Aquilegia (columbine) sun/shade</b>   |     |
|      | <b>Aquilegia General:</b> There are many forms of this wonderful flower: some form a delicate star of outer petals surrounding an inner ring with yellow centers - some have long spurs that project out behind the blossoms - others are spurless with double blossoms. All are graceful, with blue-green foliage. Aquilegia is easy to grow in loose, average to rich, well-drained soil. Self sow without being annoying. |     |
| F    | <b>Aquilegia alpina 20"</b> Deep blue flowers early summer   |     |
| T, P | <b>Aquilegia biedermeier 20"</b> Charming old fashioned cottage garden variety, covered with double mauve pink upward-facing blooms. Looks like a granny's bonnet.   |     |
| T    | <b>Aquilegia 'Dragonfly' 2'</b> Extra large flowers in bold colors or rose, blue, yellow, white, pink and crimson.   | N   |
| T, L | <b>Aquilegia vulgaris 'Black Barlow' 32"</b> Eye catching near-black double, spurless flowers  |     |
| L    | <b>Aquilegia vulgaris 'Nora Barlow' 32"</b> Double pink and white pompom flowers   |     |
| L    | <b>Aquilegia misc.</b> Tall dark purple long blooming flowers.   |     |
| T, F | <b>Aquilegia misc. 'Anything Goes' 2'</b> Graceful, pendulous flowers of mixed colors, compact mounding bluish green foliage, easy care, reseeds. A wealth of flowers in sun or shade.   |     |

| T    | <b>Arisaema triphyllum 18-24"</b> Hooded bloom, striped in green, brown and white; scarlet-orange fruit in fall.   | L   |

| T    | <b>Artemisia vulgaris 'Cragg-Barber Eye' 3'</b> <i>pt.shade</i> Great garden colour! Bold, golden yellow foliage set with white flower plumes in midsummer. Best in a partially shaded situation.  |     |
|      | <b>Aruncus (goatsbeard) pt.shade/shade</b>   |     |
| L    | <b>Aruncus aethusifolius 18" (dwarf)</b> Fern like leaves, astilbe-like but more compact, white flowers in summer.   |     |
| F, L | <b>Aruncus dioicus 2'</b> Native perennial with plumes of fluffy white flowers to 6', resembles a giant astilbe with fern-like foliage. Tough as nails.  |     |
|      | <b>Asarum (ginger) (groundcover) pt.shade/shade</b>  |     |
| P    | <b>Asarum canadense 6-12"</b> Native groundcover, heart shaped green leaves  |     |
| T, L | <b>Asarum europaeum 3"</b> Glossy green kidney-shaped foliage; elegant groundcover for shade. Easy, carefree.  |     |
|      | <b>Asclepias (swamp milkweed / butterfly weed) sun/pt.shade</b>  |     |
| T    | <b>Asclepias incarnata 3-4'</b> Small, fragrant, pink to mauve umbels in July-Aug. Flowers are attractive to butterflies & larval stage of Monarchs. Erect, clump-forming, with branching stems. Attractive 3-4" seed pods which split open when ripe releasing silky-haired seeds.  |     |
| F    | <b>Asclepias tuberosa 12"-24"</b> Clusters of yellow or orange flowers in summer, host and nectar plant for butterflies. Full sun.   | N L |
|      | <b>Aster (Michaelmas daisies) sun/pt.shade</b>   |     |
|      | <b>Aster General:</b> Asters are invaluable in the hardy border, adding superb color in the autumn. Very durable and long lived. Even heavy, wet soils will suit them. Mounds of color beginning in September, in a full range of colors. Pinch back before July for best display.   |     |
| T    | <b>Aster divaricatus (native wood aster) 2-3'</b> Clouds of small white daisy-like flowers in September and October over dark green foliage. Good for dry shade.   |     |
| T    | <b>Aster dumosus 'Woods Blue' 12"</b> Lavender blue daisy-like flowers Aug-Sept. Compact, dark green, disease resistant and rust free foliage  |     |
| T    | <b>Aster laevis 'Blue Meadow' 3-4'</b> Deep sky blue flower clusters in profusion atop vase-shaped plants. Very late bloomer. Extends the beautiful blue of fall Asters. Vigorous.   |     |
| L    | <b>Aster novae-angliae 'Alma Potschke' 4-5'</b> Bright pink daisy-like flowers, cut back to 12" early July for fuller bloom.   | N   |
| P    | <b>Aster novae-angliae 'Purple Dome' 20"</b> Compact and free flowering. A stunning, deep purple. Disease resistant.   | N   |

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| F  |  | <b>Aster novi-belgii 'Royal Opal' 12-15"</b> Dwarf, purplish blue flowers w/yellow centers, fall  |   |
| L  |  | <b>Aster novi-belgii cv. 15-24"</b> Daisy-like flowers, shades of purple, blue and pink in fall.  |   |
| O  |  | <b>Aster oblongifolius 'October Skies' 18"</b> Compact plants covered with dark blue flowers in fall  |   |
| T  |  | <b>Aster misc. 3-5'</b> Varied colored flower clusters of purple, blue, or pink in profusion in fall  |   |
| <b>Astilbe (false spiraea / plume flower) pt.shade/shade</b> |  |   |   |
|  |  | <b><u>Astilbe General:</u></b> Attractive delicate fern-like foliage with showy frothy plumes midsummer in shades of pink, peach, white, rose, red. Lush deeply cut foliage is attractive for the entire season and is colored from green to bronze. Prefers rich moist soil. Can take sun if well watered. Deer resistant. |   |
| T  |  | <b>Astilbe arendsii 'Snowdrift' 1-2'</b> Excellent for the shade border and in dried arrangements. Pure white plumes in summer. Fern like foliage.  | N |
| L  |  | <b>Astilbe chinensis v. pumila 10"</b> This is a dwarf variety with red-green leaves. Striking plume-like flowers of reddish pink   |   |
| P  |  | <b>Astilbe taquetii hybrids 3'</b> Lavender pink  | N |
| T  |  | <b>Astilbe hybrid 2'</b> Lilac pink flowers. Vigorous variety in moist soil. 4' in bloom.   | N |
| O, P   |  | <b>Astilbe hybrids misc. 2.5'</b> Lavender or pink  |   |
| <b>Astrantia (masterwort) pt.shade</b>                       |  |   |   |
| T  |  | <b>Astrantia major 'Sunningdale' variegated 1-2'</b> Cottage garden plant, long bloomer. White to pinkish flowers are dense domes of tiny florets. Pale green and cream variegated foliage in spring.   | N |
| L  |  | <b>Astrantia major 18"</b> Pink tinged 1" white flowers, midsummer long bloomer.  |   |
| <b>Baptisia (false indigo) sun/pt.shade</b>                  |  |   |   |
| T, F   |  | <b>Baptisia 'Purple Smoke' 3'-4'</b> Violet blue lupine-like flower. Smokey purple stems, gray green unique foliage. Vigorous, structural & long lasting.   |   |
| <b>Boltonia (false aster) sun</b>                            |  |   |   |
| P  |  | <b>Boltonia asteroides 'Snowbank' 4'</b> Tall white flowers, late summer bloom  |   |
| <b>Brunnera (Siberian bugloss) pt.shade</b>                  |  |   |   |
| F  |  | <b>Brunnera macrophylla 18-24"</b> Resembles a giant forget me not. Sky blue flowers.   | L |
| <b>Campanula (bellflower) sun/pt.shade</b>                   |  |   |   |
| T  |  | <b><u>Campanula General:</u></b> One of our favorites! Campanulas are marvelous. A large genus from low growing to tall stately specimens (white, pink, rose, blue, lavender flowers). Long lived, easy care.   |   |
| L  |  | <b>Campanula glomerata 'Alba' 12"</b> Clusters of white flowers, long bloom in summer.  |   |
| F  |  | <b>Campanula glomerata 'Joan Elliott' 18"</b> Clusters of double purple flowers, mid summer   |   |
| O, L   |  | <b>Campanula glomerata 'Superba' 1-2'</b> Upward facing clusters of richly colored violet 'bells'. Blooms heavily in late spring through early summer.  |   |
| T  |  | <b>Campanula 'Kent Belle' 2-3'</b> Abundant nodding 2" grape blue bells. Prefers some shade.  |   |
| T, F, L  |  | <b>Campanula persicifolia misc. 8" (2-3' in bloom)</b> Sky blue or white cup shaped bells on graceful spikes in early summer. Good cut flower. Will rebloom if spikes are cut.  |   |
| <b>Centaurea (perennial bachelor button) sun/pt.shade</b>    |  |   |   |
| L  |  | <b>Centaurea dealbata 2'</b> Dark pink 1-2" flowers, often needs staking, reblooms. Fern-like foliage.  |   |
| L  |  | <b>Centaurea montana 2'</b> Violet-blue showy fringed flowers, lance-like silvery-green foliage, cut back after flowering for rebloom.  |   |
| <b>Cerastium (snow-in-summer) sun</b>                        |  |   |   |
| T  |  | <b>Cerastium tomentosum 6"</b> Good for walls, walkways and rock gardens, everlasting silver fine leafed foliage, groundcover, masses of tiny white flowers in May-June, drought tolerant   | N |

| O  |  | <b>Centranthus ruber 2'-3'</b> Rose red flowers all summer  | N |

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| T, P    | <b>Chelone lyonii 2-4'</b> Snapdragon-like, two-lipped, clear pink flowers to 1" long from late summer into fall, resemble the heads of open-mouthed turtles. Coarsely-toothed, ovate to broad-lanceolate, dark green leaves. Best grown in moist, humusy soils. |   |
|         | <b>Chrysanthemum (garden mums) sun/pt.shade</b>  |   |
| O       | <b>Chrysanthemum misc. 2'</b> Hot pink flowers late summer to early fall   |   |
|         | <b>Cimicifuga (see Actaea)</b>   |   |
|         | <b>Coreopsis (tickseed) sun/pt.shade</b>   |   |
| T       | <b>Coreopsis grandiflora 'Early Sunrise' 3'</b> Golden yellow, semi-double flowers from early summer into fall. Superb in the border. Provides a wealth of cut flowers. Deer resistant.  |   |
| L       | <b>Coreopsis verticillata rosea 12-18"</b> Rosy pink 1" flowers all summer atop threadlike foliage   |   |
| F, L    | <b>Coreopsis verticillata 'Zagreb' 12-18"</b> Golden yellow flowers all summer atop threadlike foliage.  |   |
|         | <b>Corydalis (cordyalis) sun/shade</b>   |   |
| T, F    | <b>Corydalis lutea 8-12"</b> Delicate leafy foliage, free flowering from May to September, cheery yellow flowers. Prefers rich, moist soils that never dry out in summer but not wet in winter.  |   |
|         | <b>Cryptotaenia (Japanese parsley) sun/pt.shade</b>  |   |
| T, F    | <b>Cryptotaenia japonica atropurpurea 26"</b> Attractive chocolate colored maple-like foliage, tiny pale pink flowers, nice color contrast in borders.   |   |
|         | <b>Darmera (umbrella plant) pt.shade</b>   |   |
| T       | <b>Darmera peltata (aka Peltiphyllum peltata) 3'</b> Striking plant for bog garden. Dome-shaped clusters of pink starry flowers appear on long stalks before the 1-2' leaves unfurl.   | N |
|         | <b>Dianthus (maiden pinks) sun / well drained soil</b>   |   |
| T       | <b>Dianthus deltoides 'Flashing Lights' 6-10"</b> Single brilliant deep red flowers above an evergreen mat of foliage. Needs good drainage. Excellent as edging and in rock gardens & walls.   | N |
|         | <b>Dicentra (bleeding heart) pt.shade/shade</b>  |   |
| P       | <b>Dicentra culcullaria (Dutchman's Breeches) 12"</b> Pink or white heart-shaped flowers, ever blooming. Grayish-green fern-like foliage.  |   |
| L       | <b>Dicentra eximia (fringed bleeding heart) 15"</b> Ferny, clumping grayish-green foliage. Pink nodding heart-shaped flowers spring through summer.  |   |
| T, P    | <b>Dicentra spectabilis misc. 2-3'</b> Sprays of pendant, heart-shaped flowers above fern-like foliage in spring. Either showy deep rose or white. Summer dormant.   |   |
|         | <b>Digitalis (foxglove) sun/pt.shade</b>   |   |
| T, F    | <b>Digitalis grandiflora (aka ambigua) 2-3'</b> Perennial variety with soft yellow flowers. Excellent vertical accent.   |   |
|         | <b>Echinacea (coneflower) sun/pt.shade</b>   |   |
|         | <b><u>Echinacea General:</u></b> One of the best border plants. Flower petals radiate downward from a pronounced central seed head. Excellent cut flower, attractive to butterflies. Easy to grow. Flowers from July to frost.                                   |   |
| T,F,L,P | <b>Echinacea purpurea 3'</b> Big daisy-like lavender pink blooms on stately plants. Showy!   |   |
| T       | <b>Echinacea 'Baby Swan White' 2'</b> Dwarf habit with regular sized blooms up to 5" across throughout summer. Pure white petals with yellow central cones.  | N |
| K       | <b>Echinacea 'Bravado' 3-4'</b> Rosy red flowers   |   |
|         | <b>Echinops (globe thistle) sun</b>  |   |
| F, K, O | <b>Echinops ritro 3'</b> Steely blue spiky globe shaped flowers on sturdy stems in summer. Drought tolerant.   |   |
| F       | <b>Echinops ritro 3'</b> White variety - off white spiky flowers in summer.  | N |
|         | <b>Epimedium (barrenwort / bishop's hat) pt.shade/shade</b>  |   |
| P, L    | <b>Epimedium rubrum 8-12"</b> Bright crimson and cream white flowers, spring bloom. Pointed, heart-shaped leaflets on wiry stems, new growth has reddish tinge, reddish fall color.  |   |
| T, P    | <b>Epimedium versicolor 'Sulfureum' 10-15"</b> Delicate sprays of yellow spring flowers. Lush, heart shaped foliage, semi-evergreen groundcover, drought tolerant when established.  |   |
|         | <b>Eupatorium (Joe pye weed) pt.shade</b>  |   |

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| T    |  | <b>Eupatorium misc. 4-6'</b> Common wild flowers which make excellent garden plants. Attracts butterflies. Fluffy pink flower heads late season.   |     |
|      |  | <b>Euphorbia (spurge) sun/pt.shade</b>   |     |
| T, L |  | <b>Euphorbia dulcis 'Chameleon' 12-18"</b> Yellow flowers with the outer bracts turning chartreuse. Luscious purple-maroon foliage - the more sun the deeper the foliage. Self seeds.  |     |
| L    |  | <b>Euphorbia cyparissias 'Fens Ruby' 6"</b> Late spring, chartreuse bracts, yellow flowers, blue green foliage. Spreads especially in sun.   |     |
| L    |  | <b>Euphorbia polychroma 14"</b> Clumping plant, oval leaves, bright yellow bracts, fall color.   |     |
|      |  | <b>FERNS pt.shade/shade</b>  |     |
| L    |  | <b>Athyrium filix-femina (lady fern) 3'</b> Deciduous fern, long pointed fronds.   |     |
| T, P |  | <b>Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum' (Japanese painted fern) 16"</b> <i>2004 Perennial Plant of the Year!</i> A showy combination of colorful fronds of grey-green blended with wine red. Lacy leaves are wide and taper to a delicate point. Deer resistant.  |     |
| T    |  | <b>Asparagus officinalis var. pseudoscaber (hardy asparagus fern) 4'</b> A striking accent & great textural element with delicate lacy green clouds of see-through foliage. 2' wide mound of foliage lasts into early fall, when it changes to yellow with a crop of red berries. (Note: this rarely gets divided) | N   |
| T    |  | <b>Athyrium niponicum 'Ghost' (ghost fern) 18-24"</b> Silvery white fronds that change to green. Vigorous, deciduous upright fern with elegant appearance. Its silvery-chalky-gray foliage pulls light into shady woodland gardens.  | N   |
| T    |  | <b>Dryopteris filix-mas (male fern) 3'</b> Upright habit, lance-shaped 2 pinnate fronds. Moist, fertile, acidic soil. A grand statement in the woodland garden.  |     |
| T    |  | <b>Matteuccia struthiopteris 'Ostrich Fern' 3-6'</b> Green fronds are shaped like ostrich plumes. Dramatic. Spreads. Needs moist soil.   |     |
|      |  | <b>Filipendula (meadowsweet) sun/shade</b>   |     |
| L    |  | <b>Filipendula hexapetala 2'</b> Fluffy creamy white flowers above fern-like foliage. Native.  | N   |
| T, P |  | <b>Filipendula palmata 4'</b> Victorian looking foamy sprays of creamy pinkish white, late June. Attractive palmate foliage. Easy care.  |     |
| L    |  | <b>Filipendula ulmaria 'Kahone' 2-3'</b> Dwarf. Rosy-pink feathery plums over low mound of ferny rosettes, July-August.  |     |
| L    |  | <b>Filipendula ulmaria 'Variagata' 2'</b> Creamy white flowers over variagated yellow & green leaves   | N   |
|      |  | <b>Fragaria (ornamental strawberry) sun</b>  |     |
| O    |  | <b>Fragaria 'Pink Panda' 4-6"</b> Strawberry type foliage with bright pink flowers, blooms late summer to fall.  |     |
| L    |  | <b>Fragaria 'Lipstick' 4-6"</b> Glossy strawberry type foliage with bright rosy flowers, blooms late summer to fall. Carefree.   | N   |
|      |  | <b>Gaillardia (Indian blanket) sun</b>   |     |
| T    |  | <b>Gaillardia aristata 'Orange &amp; Lemon' 12-15"</b> Showy yellow/orange flowers in summer, long flowering. Loose poor well drained soil best.   | N L |
| K    |  | <b>Gaillardia grandiflora 'Arizona Sun' 8"-10"</b> Red-orange flowers on compact blooms.   | N   |
|      |  | <b>Galanthus (snowdrops) pt.shade</b>  |     |
| T    |  | <b>Galanthus nivalis 4-6"</b> Blooms weeks before crocuses. Clear white nodding 1" bell-like flower with emerald green tipped inner segments. Naturalizes.   | N   |
|      |  | <b>Gaura (wand flower) sun</b>   |     |
| T    |  | <b>Gaura lindheimeri 'Whirling Butterflies' 3-4'</b> Vase shaped plant that never stops blooming through October, white flowers dance in a breeze on arching stems, nice in center of border, low basal foliage, hardier than pink variety.  |     |
|      |  | <b>Gentian (gentian) sun/pt.shade</b>  |     |
| O    |  | <b>Gentian andrewsii (Bottle gentian) 18-24"</b> Inflated, closed deep blue flowers in clusters.   | N   |
|      |  | <b>Geranium (cranesbill) sun/pt.shade</b>  |     |
|      |  | <b>Geranium General:</b> Easy to grow, dense mound attractive foliage, masses of flowers. Cut back taller varieties after first bloom to encourage rebloom and compactness.  |     |

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| T   |  | <b>Geranium dalmaticum 3-6"</b> Cushion-forming geranium with deeply cut leaves and pairs of flowers in soft pink during early summer; good choice for a rock garden. Good drainage.  | N |
| F   |  | <b>Geranium 'Karmina' 6"-10"</b> Spreading plant with massed pink flowers   | N |
| L   |  | <b>Geranium macrorrhizum 15"</b> Dark pink 1" flowers held above foliage. Will spread to 2' wide over time. Good rebloomer.   |   |
| T   |  | <b>Geranium macrorrhizum 'Ingwersen's Variety' 12-18"</b> A great groundcover geranium. Light pink flowers with darker sepals and stems are held high above wonderfully fragrant foliage. Tolerates bright shade and drier soils.   | N |
| T   |  | <b>Geranium renardii 12"</b> Grown for velvet, fuzzy, textured foliage in tidy round clumps; semi-evergreen. Clusters of pale lilac flowers.  | N |
| T   |  | <b>Geranium sanguineum 8-12"</b> Pink-reddish purple 1" flowers all summer on low plant.  |   |
| T, F  |  | <b>Geranium, misc. 12-18"</b> Dark pink, magenta or carmine rose flowers  |   |
