	<b>Actaea (bugbane / baneberry)    sun/pt.shade (reclassified from Cimicifuga)</b>	
L	<b>Actaea alba (doll's eyes) 2-3'</b> Clump forming, white flower stalks, white berries w/black dots in fall.	V
T,L,P	<b>Actaea racemosa 5-6'</b> Native, slender spikes of white flowers in summer. Striking.	V
L	<b>Actaea simplex 'Brunette' 6'</b> White flowers in fall, fragrant, dark foliage, takes shade	
	<b>Agastache (anise hyssop)    sun</b>	
T	<b>Agastache 'Black Adder' 30-36"</b> Numerous dense bottlebrush flowers, nearly-black buds and rich, deep red-violet blooms atop anise scented foliage. Carefree.	N
T	<b>Agastache foeniculum 'Fragrant Delight' (lavender hyssop) 5'</b> Colorful spikes of lavender flowers are edible, fragrant and good cut. Attracts hummingbirds, bees, butterflies. Rub crushed leaves on skin to repel mosquitos. Use as a seasoning and for making tea.	N,L
F	<b>Agastache foeniculum 2'-3'</b> Lavender blue flower spikes midsummer, easy, self seeds, fragrant	
T	<b>Agastache 'Heatwave' 3'</b> Heat and humidity tolerant hot-pink flowers remain colorful for months. Perfect background or specimen plant. Attractive to hummingbirds, bees, butterflies. Wonderfully fragrant licorice-scented foliage good for flavoring drinks and drying.	N
	<b>Alchemilla (lady's mantle)    sun/pt.shade</b>	
T,L	<b>Alchemilla mollis 10-16"</b> Handsome edger. Sprays of chartreuse flowers in July, splendid fan shaped pleated foliage that collect dew drops as sparkling jewels, good cut flowers.	
	<b>Allium (ornamental onion)    sun – well drained soil</b>	
	<b>Allium General:</b> Drought tolerant. Very easy to grow, carefree, needs a dry location. Showy in mass. Flowers can be dried by standing upright in a container without water. Blossoms tower above foliage. Deer proof.	
T	<b>Allium hollandicum 'Purple Sensation' 2'</b> Large purple sphere blossoms on 3' stems, let self seed after 1st year. Summer dormant so inter-plant with perennials.	
T	<b>Allium moly luteum 14"</b> Golden Yellow star shaped flowers. . Blooms May-June. Excellent for rock gardens and cut flower.	
T	<b>Allium senescens 1'</b> Bright green flat foliage. 3" lavender-pink umbels on 20" stems in July-Aug. Drought tolerant.	
L	<b>Allium misc 12"</b> Pale 1.5" purple flowers in midsummer	
	<b>Amsonia (blue star)    sun/pt.shade</b>	

T,F	<b>Amsonia tabernaemontana 3-4'</b> Willow-like leaves, golden fall color, light blue starry flowers May-June. Easy to grow, long-lived structural plant.	
	<b>Anemone (Japanese windflower) pt.shade</b>	
T	<b>Anemone hupehensis 'Pamina' 3'</b> Vigorous, compact. Showy double 2-3" rose-pink flowers of overlapping petals & yellow centers on long branching stems. Long bloom in late season.	
L	<b>Anemone tomentosa 'Robustissima' 3'</b> Pale pink flowers on extremely hardy plants	
	<b>Aquilegia (columbine) sun to shade</b>	
	<b><u>Aquilegia General:</u></b> There are many forms of this wonderful flower: some form a delicate star of outer petals surrounding an inner ring with yellow centers - some have long spurs that project out behind the blossoms - others are spurless with double blossoms. All are graceful, with blue-green foliage. Aquilegia is easy to grow in loose, average to rich, well-drained soil. Self sow without being annoying.	
T	<b>Aquilegia biedermeier 20"</b> Charming old fashioned cottage garden variety, covered with double mauve pink upward-facing blooms. Looks like a granny's bonnet.	
K	<b>Aquilegia 'Lime Sorbet' 30"-36"</b> Lime green/white flowers	N
T,L	<b>Aquilegia vulgaris 'Black Barlow' 32"</b> Eye catching near black double, spurless flowers	
L	<b>Aquilegia vulgaris 'Nora Barlow' 32"</b> Soft rosy petals tipped w/ white, held high above foliage	
T,F	<b>Aquilegia misc. 'Anything Goes' 2'</b> Graceful, pendulous flowers of mixed colors, compact mounding bluish green foliage, easy care, reseeds. A wealth of flowers in sun or shade

T,P	<b>Arabis misc. 4-6"</b> Masses of blooms in spring on cushion-forming plants. Rock garden or edging perennial.	
	<b>Arisaema (Jack in the Pulpit) pt.shade/shade</b>	
T,F	<b>Arisaema triphyllum 18-24"</b> Hooded bloom, striped in green, brown and white; scarlet-orange fruit in fall.

L	<b>Aruncus aethusifolius 18"</b> Dwarf. Fern like leaves, white flowers, resembles compact astilbe. Native.

T	<b>Asarum canadense 6-12"</b> Native groundcover, heart shaped green leaves	V
T,L	<b>Asarum europaeum 3"</b> Glossy green kidney-shaped foliage; elegant groundcover for shade. Easy, carefree.	
	<b>Asclepias (milkweed) sun/pt.shade</b>	
F	<b>Asclepias tuberosa (butterfly weed) 12"-18"</b> Bright orange flower clusters, attracts butterflies, native	V
	<b>Aster (Michaelmas daisies) sun/pt.shade</b>	
	<b><u>Aster General:</u></b> Asters are invaluable in the hardy border, adding superb color in the autumn. Very durable and long lived. Even heavy, wet soils will suit them. Mounds of color beginning in September, in a full range of colors. Pinch back before July for best display.	
L	<b>Aster novae-angliae 'Alma Potschke' 4'-5'</b> Bright pink daisies, cut back to 12" in early July for fuller bloom	
T,P	<b>Aster novae-angliae 'Purple Dome' 20"</b> Compact and free flowering. A stunning, deep purple. Disease resistant.	
T	<b>Aster novi-belgii 'Raspberry Swirl' 2'</b> Compact. Vivid deep raspberry-red daisy-like flowers with contrasting yellow centers. The foliage is mildew resistant.	N
	<b>Astilbe (false spiraea / plume flower) pt.shade/shade</b>	
	<b><u>Astilbe General:</u></b> Attractive delicate fern-like foliage with showy frothy plumes midsummer in shades of pink, peach, white, rose, red. Lush deeply cut foliage is attractive for the entire season and is colored from green to bronze. Prefers rich moist soil. Can take sun if well watered. Deer resistant.	

T	<b>Astilbe arendsii 'Etna' 2'</b> Deep carmine-red flower plumes in early summer that stand above a clump of glossy, deep bronze-green foliage. Leaves emerge red, then turn deep green with a hint of red.	N
T	<b>Astilbe arendsii 'Sister Theresa' 2'</b> Full and blocky, soft salmon-pink lavish blooms in midsummer over shiny, dark green foliage with a hint of purple. Very reliable grower.	N
L	<b>Astilbe chinensis v pumila 10"</b> Dwarf, red/green leaves, reddish pink plumes, good groundcover	
T	<b>Astilbe chinensis 'Maggie Daley' 2'</b> Pale pink blooms mid-late June.	N
T,L,M	<b>Astilbe misc. 18-36'</b> Long lasting feathery plumes in summer, fern like foliage. Unnamed hybrids available in these colors: 1) 18", rose lilac, early July 2) 2', wispy bright coral pink, early July 3) unidentified colors - bright pink, pale pink, or peach.

L	<b>Astrantia major misc 18"</b> Pink tinged 1" white flowers, midsummer, long bloomer

A	<b>Phyllostachys aureosulcata (yellow groove bamboo) 30'</b> Spreads aggressively; grow in pots and heel in for the winter, to zone 5	
A	<b>Phyllostachys bissetii (David Bisset bamboo) 20'</b> Spreads aggressively; grow in pots and heel in for the winter, to zone 5	
A	<b>Shibataea (dwarf bamboo) 4-5'</b>	
	<b>Baptisia (false indigo) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T,L	<b>Baptisia australis 3-4'</b> 2010 PPA Plant of the Year. Native, 12" spikes of blue lupine-like blooms, long lived & carefree. Bushy clump of blue-green foliage, good cut foliage & flowers, attractive seed pods for crafting.	L,V
T	<b>Baptisia 'Carolina Moonlight' 3-4'</b> Soft, buttery yellow flowers in early summer on 18" spikes above foliage, resembling lupine. Long blooming. Seedpods with ornamental interest.	N
T	<b>Baptisia 'Purple Smoke' 3'-4'</b> Violet blue lupine-like flower. Smokey purple stems, gray green unique foliage. Vigorous, structural & long lasting.	
F	<b>Baptisia 'Twilite Prairie Blues' 3'</b> Hybrid of two native baptisias w/dusky purple/yellow flowers	N,L
	<b>Camassia (camas lily) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T,F	<b>Camassia quamash 18-24"</b> Tall stately spires of starry sapphire blue flowers that follow early spring bulbs. Forms dramatic clumps. Summer dormant.	
	<b>Campanula (bellflower) sun/pt.shade</b>	
	<b><u>Campanula General:</u></b> Campanulas are marvelous and one of our favorites! A large genus from low growing to tall stately specimens (mostly blue or purple, but also white, pink, rose, lavender flowers). Long lived, easy care.	
T,P	<b>Campanula carpatica 'Blue Clips' 8-10"</b> Violet blue cup shaped flowers on mounding plants. Good in borders. Long blooming.	N
T,P	<b>Campanula carpatica White Clips' 6-8"</b> Snow white upturned bellflowers. Blooms all season. Dark green, peltate foliage. Good in borders.	N
L	<b>Campanula glomerata 'Alba' 12"</b> Cluster of white flowers, long bloom in summer	
T	<b>Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance' (sedge) 6-12"</b> Evergreen sedge w/green & creamy white striped variegation. Drought tolerant once established, also grows in bogs. Good for containers.	N
L	<b>Campanula glomerata 'Superba' 1-2'</b> Upward facing clusters of richly colored violet 'bells'. Blooms heavily in late spring through early summer.	
L	<b>Campanula persicifolia misc 8" (2'-3' in bloom)</b> Sky blue or white cup shaped bells on spikes in early summer, good cut flower, will rebloom if spikes are cut back.	
T	<b>Campanula misc. 6-8"</b> 2" creamy white bells on 10" stalks with spotted wine interior. Vigorous.	
	<b>Carex (sedge) sun to shade</b>	
T	<b>Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance' (sedge) 6-12"</b> Evergreen sedge w/green & creamy white striped variegation. Drought tolerant once established, also grows in bogs. Good for containers.	
	<b>Centaurea (cornflower) sun/pt.shade</b>	
L	<b>Centaurea dealbata 2'</b> Dark pink 1"-2" flowers, reblooms, may need staking, fern like foliage	
L	<b>Centaurea montana 2'</b> Violet blue showy fringed flowers, lance-like silvery green foliage, cut back after flowering for rebloom

T		<b>Chrysanthemum koreana 'Mei Kyo' 3'</b> Small, double lavender button blooms in October. Clump gradually spreads but doesn't need to be divided regularly. Takes more shade than most Chrysanthemums. Well-drained soil.	
T		<b>Chrysanthemum koreana 'Sheffield' (aka Dendranthema rubellum) 30"</b> Salmony pink yellow-eyed daisy flowers in abundance, very long flowering. A mound of color in late season.	
M		<b>Chrysanthemum nipponicum (Montauk Daisy) 2-3'</b> White flowers late summer/fall	N
M		<b>Chrysanthemum parthenium (feverfew) 18"</b> Perennial herb, white flowers, self seeds	N

T,P		<b>Coreopsis grandiflora 'Sante Fe' 16"</b> Abundance of bright yellow daisies all summer. Good cut and in containers. Remove spent flowers.	N

T,F		<b>Corydalis lutea 8-12"</b> Delicate leafy foliage, free flowering from May to September, cheery yellow flowers. Prefers rich, moist soils that never dry out in summer but not wet in winter.

	<b>Cryptotaenia (Japanese parsley) sun/pt.shade</b>		
T,F		<b>Cryptotaenia japonica atropurpurea 26"</b> Attractive chocolate colored maple-like foliage, tiny pale pink flowers, nice color contrast in borders.	
	<b>Darmera (umbrella plant) pt.shade</b>		
T		<b>Darmera peltata (aka Peltiphyllum peltata) 3'</b> Striking plant for bog garden. Dome-shaped clusters of pink starry flowers appear on long stalks before the 1-2' leaves unfurl.	N
	<b>Delosperma (hardy Ice plant) sun</b>		
A		<b>Delosperma 'John Proffitt' 4"</b> Purple flowers June-Sept.	
	<b>Dianthus (pinks) sun</b>		
T		<b>Dianthus gratianopolitanus 'Wicked Witch' 6"</b> Clove-scented, deep cherry pink flowers rise 12" above dense, grayish semi-evergreen foliage in May and June. Nice mounding habit is great for border front, rock garden. Tolerates drought.	N
F		<b>Dianthus misc. 4"</b> Spreads to form a mat covered with tiny pink flowers	
	<b>Dicentra (bleeding heart) pt.shade/shade</b>		
L,M		<b>Dicentra eximia (fringed bleeding heart) 15"</b> Ferny, grayish-green foliage. Pink or white nodding heart-shaped flowers spring through summer.	
P		<b>Dicentra spectabilis misc. 2-3'</b> Sprays of pendant, heart-shaped flowers above fern-like foliage in spring. Showy deep rose or white. Summer dormant.	
	<b>Digitalis (foxglove)</b>		
T		<b>Digitalis lutea (perennial) 3'</b> Creamy yellow flowers. Stalks are lined with many creamy yellow flowers. Simple elegance. Glossy green, narrow-leaved foliage.	
	<b>Echinacea (coneflower) sun/pt.shade</b>		
		<b>Echinacea General:</b> One of the best border plants. Flower petals radiate downward from a pronounced central seed head. Excellent cut flower, attractive to butterflies. Easy to grow. Flowers	
M		<b>Echinacea 'Green Jewel' 3'</b> Bright green petals, darker green cone	N
M		<b>Echinacea 'Hot Papaya' 3'</b> Double orange/red flowers	N
K		<b>Echinacea 'Magnus' 3'</b> Large flowers, petals held horizontally rather than reflexed	
M		<b>Echinacea 'Milkshake' 3'</b> Large double white pompom flowers	N
M		<b>Echinacea paradoxa (Ozark coneflower) 2-3'</b> Native, yellow flowers, parent of most of the newer hybrids. Seeds a favorite of goldfinches.	V
M		<b>Echinacea 'Pink Double Delight' 3'</b> Double pink flowers	N

T,P,K	<b>Echinacea 'Pow Wow Wild Berry' 2'</b> Floriferous bright pink flowers that don't fade. Has won numerous honors.	N
T,L,F,M	<b>Echinacea purpurea 3'</b> Big daisy-like lavender pink blooms on stately plants. Showy! Easy care.	
	<b>Epimedium (barrenwort / bishop's hat) pt.shade/shade</b>	
T,P	<b>Epimedium grandiflora 'Lilafee' 8-10"</b> Clusters of long-spurred lavender-violet flowers above heart-shaped foliage. Leaves emerge dark red, turn green and then coppery red in fall.	N
L	<b>Epimedium rubrum 8"-12"</b> Bright crimson and cream white flowers, spring bloom. Pointed, heart-shaped leaflets on wiry stems, new growth has reddish tinge, reddish fall color	
P	<b>Epimedium misc.</b> Delicate sprays of yellow, white, or purple early spring flowers. Lush, heart shaped foliage, semi-evergreen groundcover, drought tolerant when established.	
	<b>Eupatorium (Joe pye weed) pt.shade</b>	
T,P	<b>Eupatorium dubium 'Baby Joe' 30"</b> Cabernet flowers attract butterflies in late summer. Enjoy its winter silhouette.	N
	<b>Euphorbia (spurge) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T	<b>Euphorbia amygdaloides purpurea 12-18"</b> Handsome burgundy-purple foliage sets off clusters of bright greenish-yellow flowers in mid-late spring. Remains evergreen. Self seeds.	
L	<b>Euphorbia cyparissias 'Fens Ruby' 6"</b> Late spring, chartreuse bracts, yellow flowers, blue green foliage. Spreads especially in sun - better behaved in shade.	
L	<b>Euphorbia dulcis 'Chameleon' 12-18"</b> Yellow flowers with the outer bracts turning chartreuse. Luscious purple-maroon foliage - the more sun the deeper the foliage. Self seeds.	
L	<b>Euphorbia polychroma 14"</b> Clumping plant, oval leaves, bright yellow bracts, fall color. Native.	V
	<b>FERNS pt.shade/shade</b>	
T	<b>Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum' (Japanese painted fern) 16"</b> 2004 Perennial Plant of the Year! A showy combination of colorful fronds of grey-green blended with wine red. Lacy leaves are wide and taper to a delicate point. Deer resistant.	
T	<b>Athyrium niponicum 'Ghost' (ghost fern) 18-24"</b> Silvery white fronds that change to green. Vigorous, deciduous upright fern with elegant appearance. Its silvery-chalky-gray foliage pulls light into shady woodland gardens.	
A	<b>Dryopteris erythrosora (autumn fern) 18"</b> Colorful groundcover with pink fiddleheads that turn coppery orange as they unfurl giving tapestry effect.	
T,L	<b>Dryopteris misc. 2'</b> Hardy woodland fern that doesn't mind some afternoon sun. Spreads on underground runners.	
T	<b>Matteuccia struthiopteris 'Ostrich Fern' (fiddlehead fern) 3-6'</b> Green fronds are shaped like ostrich plumes. Dramatic. Spreads. Needs moist soil. Harvest fiddleheads to eat.	
	<b>Filipendula (meadowsweet) sun to shade</b>	
L	<b>Filipendula hexapetala misc. 2'</b> Native perennial bears heads of fluffy creamy white flowers above fern like foliage.	V
L	<b>Filipendula 'Kahome' 1'</b> Sprays of rosy flowers over green rosettes, July-August.	
L	<b>Filipendula palmata 'Nana' 16"</b> Mounding habit. Feathery plumes of rosy-pink flowers.	
T	<b>Filipendula palmata misc. 2-4'</b> Victorian looking foamy sprays of creamy pinkish white, late June. Attractive palmate foliage. Easy care.	
L	<b>Filipendula ulmaria 'Variagata' 2'</b> Creamy white flowers over variagated yellow & green leaves	
	<b>Fragaria (ornamental strawberry) sun</b>	
T	<b>Fragaria 'Pink Panda' 4- 6"</b> Strawberry type foliage with bright pink flowers, blooms summer to fall. Carefree.	
L	<b>Fragaria 'Lipstick' 4- 6"</b> Glossy 'running' strawberry type foliage with bright rosy flowers, blooms late summer to fall. Carefree.	
	<b>Gaura (wand flower) sun</b>	
T,L	<b>Gaura lindheimeri 'Whirling Butterflies' 3-4'</b> Vase shaped plant, white flowers dance in a breeze on arching stems, blooms through October, nice in center of border, low basal foliage, hardier than pink variety.	
	<b>Geranium (cranesbill) sun/pt.shade</b>	

	<b><u>Geranium General:</u></b> Easy to grow, dense mound attractive foliage, masses of flowers. Cut back taller varieties after first bloom to renew foliage and encourage rebloom.	
L	<b>Geranium cantabrigiense 'Karmina' 6-10"</b> Spreading plant with massed pink flowers	
T	<b>Geranium endresii 'Wargrave Pink' 18-30"</b> Clump-forming, slightly lobbed glossy leaves. Pink/purple veined flowers.	
L	<b>Geranium macrorrhizum 15"</b> Dark pink 1" flowers held above foliage. Will spread to 2' wide over time. Good rebloomer.	
L	<b>Geranium maculatum 'Expresso' 18"</b> Very attractive dark foliage with upward facing lavender-pink flowers.	N
L	<b>Geranium phaeum 12"</b> Attractive foliage with purple markings and small, reflexed burgundy flowers. Very hardy in sun to light shade.	N
L	<b>Geranium psilostemon 20-30"</b> Magenta flowers. Summer bloomer.	N
L,F	<b>Geranium sanguineum 8-12"</b> Carmine-rose 1" flowers. June bloom with excellent rebloom all summer. Foliage is low mounding with small deeply divided leaves. Use as edging.	
<b>GRASSES &amp; GRASS-LIKE PLANTS</b>		
	<b><u>Note:</u></b> Grasses make a marvelous addition to a perennial border and add much desired fall interest as well as structural form. Plumes or seed heads as well as grass blades can be used in flower or dried arrangements. They are long-lived, sustainable, easy to grow. Grasses below are clumping unless otherwise noted.	
T	<b>Acorus gramineus 'Ogon' (sweet flag) 6-12" sun/pt.shade</b> Evergreen foliage with rich yellow variegation. Likes wet feet. Excellent in containers.	
T,F	<b>Chasmanthum latifolium 'Northern Sea Oats' 3' pt.shade</b> Interesting flat oat-like tan seed fronds on arching panicles in fall, excellent winter interest and good dried. A great grass!	
T,P	<b>Hakonechloa macra 'All Gold' 1-2' sun/pt.shade</b> Gold blades in upright graceful clumps. Reddish inflorescence in fall.	N
T,F	<b>Miscanthus sinensis Strictus (porcupine grass) 6'-7' sun</b> Neat foliage, yellow bands on green leaves.	N
F	<b>Panicum virgatum 'Heavy Metal' (switch grass) 4' sun/pt.shade</b> Blue-green leaves, pinkish colored plumes in fall, good cut. Nice in perennial beds.	
<b>Gypsophila (baby's breath) sun</b>		
T,P	<b>Gypsophila repens 'Filou rose' 6"</b> Long blooming trailing plants. Good in borders, rock gardens & containers.	N
<b>Heliopsis (false sunflower) sun/pt.shade</b>		
F	<b>Heliopsis helianthoides 24"-30"</b> Bright yellow daisy flowers all summer	
T,P	<b>Heliopsis helianthoides 'Lorraine Sunshine' 30"</b> Large yellow daisy flowers all summer, variegated foliage
